On MAY 5, 2012, Sis. Eula V Polk was awarded an ***Honorary Doctoral Degree*** for her work at Little Bethel CME Church and the Terry Community. My work in the church included the following: ***Sunday School teacher, secretary, treasurer for the church., members of the usher board, a choir member, stewardess (twenty-five years), steward for (1 year), she is also Honorary Steward, Stewardess Emeritus, one year as Missionary President and many years as a delegate to District Conferences, Annual Conferences, Quadrennial Missionary Assemblies and delegate to the General Conference.*** Also, she has served as ***District Treasurer, District Zone Leader (8 years), District Stewardess and Worship Leader.*** The list goes on, and on – ***just like the Energizer Bunny and still going!!***

When Sis. Polk was asked about her dedication to Little Bethel and the CME Church she stated, “In 1921 I united with Little Bethel CME Church here in Terry, Mississippi.
